

CALL TO THE BAR MICHAELMAS TERM 2017

The Middle Temple will offer the following Michaelmas Call ceremonies in 2017;

Michaelmas A Call 1.00pm, Thursday 23 November 6.00pm, Thursday 23 November

You will only be eligible for Call in Michaelmas Term 2017 if you have:

- successfully completed your BPTC program or BTT, and
- completed enough Qualifying Sessions (minimum of 11 QS) (Specially Qualified Applicants with approval from the Bar Standards Board exempted).

Please find attached the Call Application Form. I also attach a document entitled Call Information.

The following should <u>all</u> be returned to the Treasury Office before the stated closing date (please note that we will not consider your application to be complete until we have received all of these):

- the Call Declaration (completed correctly)
- the Call Application Cover Sheet
- two acceptable Character References
- payment of the Call Fee (card details provided by phone or in person)
- the Qualifying Session Questionnaire

N.B. The Call form should be printed SINGLE-SIDED (i.e. not back-to-back) on plain white A4 paper as this document is bound, together with the references, for posterity.

Michaelmas Call Application Deadline

The closing date for applications for the Michaelmas Call to the Bar ceremonies is:

4pm on Friday 29 September 2017

Please submit <u>all</u> required documentation to the Inn before the relevant date above. Failure to do so may result in you not being Called on the requested date.

Call Ceremony Tickets

As space in Hall is limited, we can only guarantee <u>two guest tickets per Callee for the Call Ceremony</u>. There is a chance, however, that some Callees may be able to bring a third guest in November. You will have an opportunity to apply for extra guest tickets once you have received confirmation from us that you will be Called. Please note that this will not be until we receive all of the BPTC results from *all* of the BPTC Institutes, including the results from resits.

Buffet/Dinner Tickets

You are welcome to buy tickets for the buffet meal after the ceremony for yourself and your guests. It is possible for you to bring more than two guests to the buffet as we are not as limited on space as we are for the ceremony.

Please note: the meal following the Call ceremony can be your 12th Qualifying Session. The Call ceremony alone is <u>not</u> a QS.

Payment for any photography is a matter between you and the photographer and is not done through the Inn.

CALL INFORMATION

Middle Temple Students of all BPTC Institutions, and Specially Qualified Applicants who have been admitted to Middle Temple, will be eligible to apply for Call.

Members wishing to be Called to the Bar in Michaelmas Term 2017 are required to submit their completed application form, references and call fee to the Treasury Office on or before **Friday 29 September 2017.**

Character References: Two letters of recommendation addressed to the Masters of the Bench must accompany your application. These should be completed by appropriate professional people who have known you for at least one year, had regular contact with you in the last year and are not related to you.

Please note: we will accept references from BPTC tutors who have known you for the academic year, rather than a full calendar year.

The referee *must* indicate:

- the period of time they have known you for
- the capacity in which they know you
- how they came to know you
- that they are still in regular contact with you.
- they must also confirm that you "are a fit and proper person to be Called to the Bar". This exact phrase should be contained within their letter.

References must be on **professional headed notepaper**, **dated and signed with an original signature** (not scanned/ photocopied or signed on the writer's behalf).

Call Fee:

The preferred payment method is by debit card or credit card.

<u>DO NOT provide card details with your application if you are posting it</u> – please phone the office to provide your card details once you have submitted your application. Those students who were awarded an Entrance Exhibition (Harmsworth or Blackstone) are not required to pay the Call fee. [If you cannot pay by card, please contact Sally Yorke on s.yorke@middletemple.org.uk to discuss alternative options]

Qualifying Sessions (QS): Please note that you will only be eligible for Call if you have completed enough Qualifying Sessions (minimum of 11 QS). The optional meal after the Call ceremony can count as your 12th QS. You can hand in your application form before you have completed all of your QS, however, **these must be booked in advance**.

Michaelmas A Call Ceremony, 1.00pm: Candidates are asked to assemble at Middle Temple Hall on Call Day at 12.00pm. Guests must be in Hall no later than 12.50pm.

Michaelmas B Call Ceremony, 6.00pm: Candidates are asked to assemble at Middle Temple Hall on Call Day at 5.00pm. Guests must be in Hall no later than 5.50pm.

Call in Absentia: In exceptional circumstances, permission from the Masters of the Bench may be sought if any student wishes to be Called in Absentia. This must be a formal written request outlining the reason why you cannot be Called in person. Please contact us if you think you may need to be Called in Absentia.

Dress code for Callees: You must attend the Call ceremony in court dress, e.g. wig, gown and bands (these can be hired for the day from Ede & Ravenscroft)

In addition to the wig, gown and bands, you should wear;

- a plain black (or very dark grey) suit (double-breasted or three piece suit for men)
- ❖ a white wing-collared shirt (a collaret is acceptable for women)
- formal, black shoes. When choosing your footwear, do bear in mind that you will be standing for the length of the ceremony. Sandals are not appropriate.
- ❖ Your hair tied back if it is below shoulder length

For this purpose a "criminal offence" means any offence, wherever and whenever committed, under the criminal law of any jurisdiction except (i) an offence for which liability is capable of being discharged by payment of a fixed penalty; and (ii) an offence which has as its main ingredient the unlawful parking of a vehicle. ⁴ For this purpose, a "debt relief order" includes a debt relief order made pursuant to the Insolvency Act 1986 and any similar order made in any jurisdiction in the world.

⁴ A "directors disqualification order" includes a disqualification order made by a court, or disqualification undertaking accepted by the secretary of state, pursuant to the Company Directors Disqualification Act 1986 and any similar order or undertaking made or given in any jurisdiction in the world.

⁶ For this purpose a "bankruptcy restrictions order" includes a disqualification order made by a court or a bankruptcy restrictions undertaking accepted pursuant to the Insolvency Act 1986 and any similar order or undertaking made or given in any jurisdiction in the world.

⁷ For this purpose a "debt relief restrictions order" includes a debt relief restrictions order made by a court or a debt relief restrictions undertaking made or given in any jurisdiction in the world.

Data Protection

The Honourable Society of the Middle Temple (the Inn) processes and stores personal information in accordance with the Data Protection Act 1998 and the Inn's Data Protection Policy.

By submitting your application for membership of the Inn, you are agreeing to the Inn storing and using your data to administer your membership, for the processing of financial transactions and maintaining accounts, for the management of enquiries and complaints and to produce summary information for statistical, regulatory and audit purposes. We may, with your permission, use your data to inform you about developments within or pertaining to the profession, inform you about and manage your involvement with educational and membership services and events, and to manage your involvement with any committees you might join. The information that the Inn holds is mainly provided by yourself, but may also be collected from other sources such as references or information already in the public domain. The information will be held securely and will only be accessed by Inn staff with appropriate permissions. By submitting this application you are agreeing to this data being kept and used for the duration of your membership and that some of that information may be kept permanently by the Inn for historical purposes.

You have a right to change or access your information at any time. <u>It is your responsibility</u> to notify the Inn of any changes to your personal details so that the information that we hold on you is accurate and kept up to date.

Third Parties

Your information will not be distributed to Third Parties unless it is anonymised, you give us explicit consent to do so, we are required to do so under a statutory or legal obligation, or are permitted to do so by the Data Protection Act. There are a small number of reasons where we may need to share some of your information with Third Parties for processes essential to managing your membership. In order to manage admission and scholarship applications, disciplinary proceedings, and Call to the Bar, we will need to share some of your basic information with the General Council of the Bar (also known as the Bar Council) and the other Inns of Court. For example, we will need to share your name and which Inn you have applied to/are a member of should your application for admission be unsuccessful or if you are found guilty of misconduct that results in your expulsion from the Middle Temple. This is to comply with Bar Standards Board regulation (Section B2, Rule rQ11). We will also provide the Bar Council with some equality information, if provided, for statutory purposes.

Photographs at events

Please also be aware that occasionally we may take photographs of members at our events. These may be used for promotional purposes by the Inn, including in printed publications, on our website, and on our social media accounts promoting the Inn. To comply with the Data Protection Act 1998, we need your permission before we can photograph you. If you would not like to be photographed at events please contact the Data Protection Officer, using the contact details on our website below, so that we can add this information to your member record. You will be given further opportunities to opt out of being photographed when you book an event and also during events.
