They are now widely viewed as the authoritative global reference point for the respective roles business and governments play with regard to ensuring business respect for human rights.

This session will examine the benefits for the legal profession of being engaged and aware of the UNGPs both as providers of legal services, and as businesses themselves. The expert panel will include Peter Rees QC, 39 Essex Street, Nicole Bigby, Berwin Leighton Paisner and Pip McKenzie, Unilever.
