

### **The Middle Temple Trust Funds**

The Scholarship Fund Appeal was started in 2003 to maintain and increase the level of funding and the number of scholarships awarded each year, with the aim of raising £5 million. At the end of 2012, the Appeal Fund had reached £2.9 million. The Inn's primary purpose is to ensure that those individuals of real ability, who the Inn believes can succeed in the profession, are not precluded from coming to the Bar by a lack of financial resources.

The principal criteria for the award of scholarships are the quality of the applicant and their commitment to the principles of independent practice. All scholarships are awarded on merit. Once identified as a Scholar of the Inn, an individual is awarded an amount which is tailored to ensure that the most significant assistance is given to those students most in need. Middle Temple interviews all scholarship applicants and, uniquely, always takes account of means when assessing the value of any scholarship award. Middle Temple Access to the Bar Scheme was launched in early 2011 and provides opportunities for applicants from disadvantaged backgrounds to spend one week in chambers and one week marshalling in court with a judge. Each is paid £250 per week. It is open to students from the end of their first year at university onwards and may therefore be seen as work experience rather than a formal, assessed mini-pupillage. It is a means of enhancing the diversity of talented applicants to the Bar as a whole and the Inn in particular. **Reader's Essay Prize** Master Crystal, the 2012 Autumn Reader, has founded a new essay prize by providing funding for the first ten years' prize money. ### **Sponsor a Rare Book**

Middle Temple Library has retained the majority of books that have been collected since its inception by Robert Ashley's bequest in 1641. As the books have been read and used through the centuries, however, they have suffered wear and tear to the point where many of them are in need of repair. Through the Rare Books Sponsorship Programme, we hope that members of the Inn, as well as members of the general public, will contribute to the restoration of these books, thus ensuring their survival for the future.

Sponsorship of a book is commemorated with a personalized bookplate placed inside it, before-and-after photographs and a thank-you letter.

Some of the books currently in need of urgent conservation work include:

- \* Musladini Sadi Rosarium politicum, by Saʻdī- a Latin translation of a book of Persian literature published in 1651 in Amsterdam, in folio size. The estimated cost of repair is £560.00
- \* Arthur Wilson's *History of Great Britain*, published in London in 1653. It details the history of the life and reign of King James the First. The estimated cost of repair is £550.00 as the book needs to be completely rebound.
- \* A book on the antiquities of Rome that belonged to Robert Ashley: Georg Fabricius's *Roma*, published in Basle in 1587. It is bound with a second illustrated work dated 1593 by G. della Porta on cryptography and cipher writing. The estimated cost of repair is £300.00

In addition to these books, there are a number of other rare books and manuscripts in need of sponsorship, including works on Byzantine history, agriculture, and folly and vices.
