MIDDLE TEMPLE LIBRARY

During term-time, the Middle Temple Library is open from 9:00 to 20:00 Monday to Thursday, 9:00 to 19:00 Friday, and one Saturday out of four (on a rota with the other Inn libraries). Out-of-term hours are Monday to Friday 9:00 to 17:30.

The Library contains print and electronic research materials covering a wide range of English legal subjects. We also provide materials on EU and US law. The Library subscribes to a range of legal databases, journals and law reports including, but not limited to: Bloomsbury Professional, i-law, Justis, Lawtel, LexisLibrary and Westlaw UK and US. The Library has published a number of guides to legal research covering UK, Irish, EU and US law, as well as parliamentary publications. These are available in the library, or pdfs can be downloaded from our website, under Library Guides. The Library has 16 public computer terminals which provide access to our electronic subscriptions, Internet, and MS Office. Photocopying and printing facilities are available (students receive a 50% discount), as is free WiFi.

MIDDLE TEMPLE LIBRARY OPEN EVENING

Join us for an informal evening introducing new members to the Library on Tuesday 2 October from 17:45 to 19:30 – members are free to drop in at any time, although there is a programme which can be viewed online via the Inn's Calendar. This is a chance to find out more about how the Library can help you as students now, as well as in the future as you begin your careers at the Bar. It is also a chance to meet other new members, as well as those established in their careers – from Benchers to new practitioners.

TOURS OF MIDDLE TEMPLE LIBRARY

A full list of our library tours is available on the Middle Temple website. Tours are offered at different times throughout September and October. Tours last approximately 30 minutes and are limited to 5 people. QUALIFYING SESSION: LEGAL RESEARCH

The Library offers training on legal research which is also a Qualifying Session, taking place on **Thursday 1 November 2018**. We will cover: legal citations, case law research in print and electronic formats, sources for commentary, UK legislation and general tips on finding legal information online. Bookings can be made via the Education Department.

QUALIFYING SESSIONS

Students are required to attend **twelve** Qualifying Sessions (QS) in order to be Called to the Bar. You are of course very welcome to attend more than twelve.

Please note: the compulsory twelve sessions must be accumulated within a period of no more than 5 years ending on the date of Call [Bar Training Rules B6. rQ76].

It is currently possible to attend the reception after your Call ceremony as your 12th QS. However, please bear in mind that this will no longer be the case from Trinity 2020 onwards. The last Call for which the old arrangement is in place will be Hilary Call in March 2020. **From Trinity Call 2020, i.e. July 2020, the collegiate event after Call will no longer count as a QS.**

ATTENDANCE AT QUALIFYING SESSIONS

- Attendance at Qualifying Sessions in Hall is recorded by the Front of House staff who collect students' tickets and check their names against a list.

The onus is on students to hand in their ticket and thus to make sure that their attendance goes on record. If you have misplaced your ticket make sure you speak to a member of staff on arrival so that they can check the list and make a note that you attended.

- To be credited with the QS, you must attend **all** elements of an event, including where applicable the pre-dinner lecture, after dinner speech or musical performance.
- Check in advance what time the doors for a QS are due to close. If you arrive late you may not be credited with the QS.
- Ensure that you arrive with plenty of time to put any coats and bags in the cloakroom (which will be staffed during the event) and collect a student gown, where applicable.

BOOKING TICKETS

Members of the Inn can book and pay for tickets for themselves and their guests online.

You cannot book tickets for another member of the Inn as your guest if they want the Qualifying Session to count on their record.

To book tickets you will have to log in to the website at www.middletemple.org.uk. If you have not yet created a log-in you can do so by clicking 'Register' at the top of the homepage ~ you will need your membership number to complete this process.

Please bear in mind:

- Unless otherwise stated, or the event sells out earlier, booking will close at midday **two working days** prior to the event.
- Payment must be made at the time of booking – we are **not** able to reserve tickets.
- When you receive your confirmation email it is your responsibility to check that all the information for your booking is correct.
- **You must print your ticket and bring it with you to the event.**

CANCELLATION POLICY

If for some reason you are unable to attend an event and would like to cancel your booking, you must contact the Treasury Office with at least **two clear working days' notice** to qualify for a refund. You cannot cancel tickets online.

For example, should an event fall on a Thursday the latest you could cancel a ticket would be the Monday of that week. For a Monday, it would be the Wednesday of the week before. N.B. Our working days are Monday – Friday inclusive, but exclude all Bank & Public Holidays.

SEATING PLANS & MESSES

For the majority of dinners, there is no seating plan: seating is first come first served for Student and Hall Members. However, with the exception of All Inn Dining, if you book 4 tickets you can request a 'mess', which means that four seats on a table will be reserved for you. This is particularly useful if you are bringing family or friends and want to ensure that you can sit together. To book a mess please contact the office *after* you have booked your tickets on 020 7427 4800 or education@middletemple.org.uk

A bit of history ~ traditionally, barristers and students were all seated in 'messes' of four for dinner. The person nearest the High Table on the left hand side of each Mess was the Captain. The Captain would serve each member of the Mess (with himself or herself last). This custom has disappeared since the food is now served individually.

DIETARY REQUIREMENTS

- Please ensure that you inform the Inn in good time if you (or any of your guests) have any special dietary requirements, e.g. Vegetarian, Vegan, Pescatarian, Halal, Gluten free, or any food allergies. Informing staff on the evening of the event may be too late so please do bear this in mind.
- Dietary information can be added to yours and your guests' tickets once you have booked them by logging onto your account on the website.

VOLUNTEERING TO BE A GUINEA PIG OR WITNESS

There are a few opportunities during the year for students to gain a Qualifying Session free of charge by acting as a guinea pig or a witness on one of our advocacy courses.

ACTING AS A 'GUINEA PIG' ON A TRAINING THE TRAINERS PROGRAMME

All the Inn's Advocacy Trainers are practitioners who have undergone a *Training the Trainers* programme. On those programmes, BPTC students are taught advocacy by new trainers who are practising the teaching method, jointly with very experienced trainers. Acting as a 'guinea pig' on a *Training the Trainers* Programme, which take place on Saturdays, is accredited as one Qualifying Session.

ACTING AS A WITNESS ON THE NEW PRACTITIONERS' PROGRAMME

In the first three years of independent practice, new practitioners are required to undertake a programme of advocacy training on which student volunteers act as witnesses. Although they will not receive any advocacy training themselves, students tend to find it very useful to observe the training given to the new practitioners. Acting as a volunteer on an NPP exercise, which take place on Saturdays, is accredited as one Qualifying Session.

SPONSORSHIP

We are aware that an institution such as the Inn, with its traditions and formality, can appear daunting. MARSHALLING

This scheme gives a student the opportunity to marshal with a judge (sit with him or her on the bench in court), usually for between 3 and 5 days. As well as showing a different perspective on the courtroom itself, it can be an opportunity to speak to the judge informally, with the possibility of being invited back to the judge's chamber, which could give further insight into the workings of a court.

ADVOCACY WEEKENDS

The Inn runs four residential advocacy training weekends each year; three at Cumberland Lodge in Windsor Great Park and one at the Royal York Hotel in York. Each weekend is accredited with three Qualifying Sessions.

The weekends are specifically for students on the BPTC, although if there are spaces available they may be offered to other members of the Inn who are post BPTC and pre-Call.

While these weekends focus on an intense programme of advocacy workshops in groups of six students, each taught by an experienced trainer, there is also ample opportunity to meet practitioners and judges in a social environment.

BE HEARD WORKSHOPS

As an advocate, you will have to be able to use your voice effectively, often over lengthy periods of time. If you have any concerns over this and/or feel you could do with some training, particularly if you have no experience of public speaking, you might be interested in doing some work on your voice.

The Inn is offering two workshop programmes run by an experienced voice trainer.

These sessions do not count as Qualifying Sessions.

Every year the Middle Temple runs a mooting competition for its student members. It is open to both BPTC and CPE/GDL students and is a pairs competition.

Wherever possible you should find your own mooting partner, and ONLY one of you should complete the application form with details for you both (if you are struggling to find a partner you can apply singularly and we will endeavour to pair you up; however, we cannot guarantee that this will be possible).

The deadline for applications is Friday 26 October 2018.

Please note that to be eligible to enter you and your partner must both be members of the Middle Temple and current students on either the BPTC or the GDL in the academic year 2018/19.

PRIZES

The four students who reach the final will take part in a mooting visit to the United States; visits alternate between the University of North Carolina in Chapel Hill and Pepperdine University in Malibu, California.

Each finalist will also receive a wig and gown.

TIMEKEEPING

Greetings from Pepperdine University School of Law!

I am the Academic Director of Pepperdine's London Law Program for the Fall Semester of 2018. A few years ago, we started the fine tradition of a mixed team moot, The Pepperdine – Middle Temple Royal Courts of Justice Moot.

As you may know, American graduate law students from Pepperdine study in London during their second or third year to take courses in international law as well as required American law courses. In addition, we organize a number of moot competitions including two against Middle Temple and Inner Temple.

One of our most popular moots is the one we host at the Royal Courts of Justice for Pepperdine and Middle Temple students. In keeping with tradition, Pepperdine University School of Law wishes to invite interested student members from Middle Temple to take part in the annual RCJ Moot Court Competition to be held on **15 November 2018 at the Royal Courts of Justice from 6.30pm to 8.30pm, followed by refreshments with the judges at the George Pub.**

There will be three courts in operation, with each court sitting for two rounds. There will be a choice of a civil case or a criminal case to be argued.

Whether you are a novice or an experienced mooter, you are encouraged to take part in this year's Pepperdine-Middle Temple Royal Courts of Justice Moot. Part of our tradition is to have mixed teams, that is, each team will be comprised of a Middle Temple student member, paired with a Pepperdine student.

Last year we had an overwhelming amount of interest in the RCJ Moot. This year we will be choosing 12 Middle Temple moot participants at random to compete. To apply to compete in this moot, complete the application form under 'Mooting v. Once you have been accepted and confirmed you will be put in touch with your Pepperdine partner.

The moot problems will be e-mailed to you by 1 November 2018. A list of authorities and skeleton arguments are to be exchanged by e-mail between mooters 48 hours in advance of the moot and also e-mailed to the judge presiding. Bundles should be prepared to present to the judges on the day of the competition. Lead Counsel will argue for 15 minutes, Junior Counsel for 10 minutes.

Come and enjoy the evening and feel free to bring your supporters.

We look forward to seeing you at the moot.

OVERSEAS SCHOLARSHIPS

There are a number of scholarships available to enable members of the Inn who have completed their BPTC to make educational visits abroad. These include trips to Hong Kong, America, Luxembourg, Israel and Canada.

The application and interview process usually takes place early in the calendar year, so you may apply whilst studying the full-time or the second year of the part-time BPTC, or after completing the BPTC. Most of the short-term trips will then take place during the summer of the year in which the scholarship is awarded.

PUPILLAGE SUPPORT

The Pupillage Gateway, managed by the Bar Council, is the online application system for pupillage. It is a Bar Standards Board requirement that all pupillages are advertised on the Pupillage Gateway for a minimum of two weeks. Some chambers will require you to apply through the system, others have their own application system. For more information please visit <http://www.pupillagegateway.com/>.

MOCK PUPILLAGE INTERVIEW SCHEME

The Inn offers those with imminent Pupillage Interviews the opportunity to practise their interview technique in front of barristers.

Applicants who have been granted a Pupillage interview may apply to the Inn using the online form and where possible will be matched with a Barrister with the appropriate specialisation from a different chambers.

PUPILLAGE INTERVIEW TRAVEL EXPENSES

The Inn has a limited fund available to support those students who incur substantial expenses in attending pupillage interviews and are finding this financially challenging.

Funding will be limited to cases of particular hardship or exceptional circumstances. Each applicant is expected to underwrite the first £200 of their expenses before seeking support from the fund.

PUPILLAGE SUPPORT GRANTS

In 2016 the Inn launched a support scheme for members who are suffering particular financial hardship during pupillage. The funds available each year are limited.

To be eligible to apply you must;

- be a member of Middle Temple.
- have been awarded a pupillage undertaking principally publicly funded work.
- be in receipt of a pupillage award (including guaranteed earnings) no greater than; £17,500 for pupillages outside of London, or £20,000 for pupillages in London.

PUPILLAGE HARDSHIP GRANTS

The Middle Temple is able to make awards to members of the Inn who are in pupillage, or who have pupillage arranged, to alleviate cases of serious unexpected hardship. Their purpose is to ensure, so far as possible, that members of the Inn with the potential to succeed at the Bar are not prevented from doing so by some unexpected financial setback. The funds available are limited.

MIDDLE TEMPLE YOUNG BARRISTERS' ASSOCIATION (MTYBA)

MTYBA - Middle Temple Young Barristers' Association represents the interests of the Inn's members from the point of being called to the Bar to 7 years post-pupillage experience. 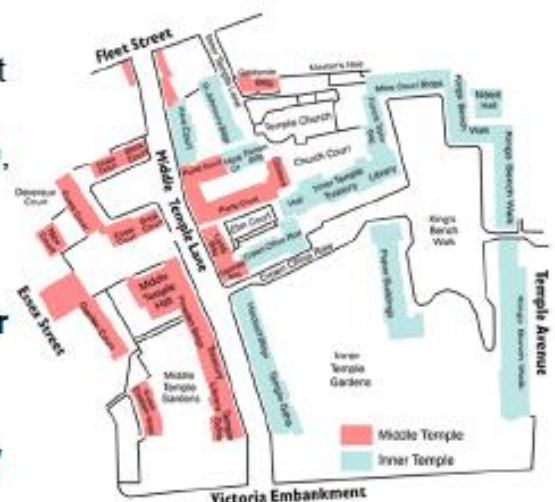

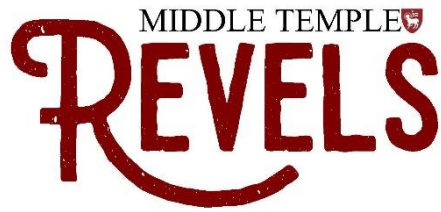

Successful applicants will be informed of the exact time, date and venue by email. Please note that it will not be possible to provide feedback to unsuccessful applicants.

It should be noted that the Vienna competition clashes with the Civil and Criminal Procedure exams in April 2019. Team members will be entitled by the BSB to defer these exams until August 2019 (as a first attempt not a re-sit).
