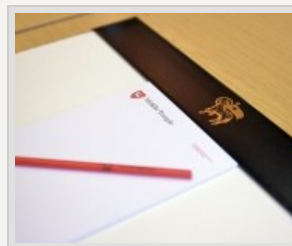

Mock Pupillage Interview Scheme

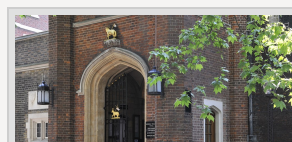

Members' Lounge Opening - Thursday 21 April 2016

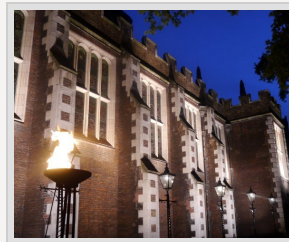

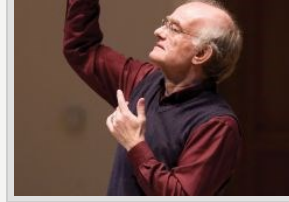
Temple Music Foundation - Come and Sing with John Rutter - Saturday 30 April 2016

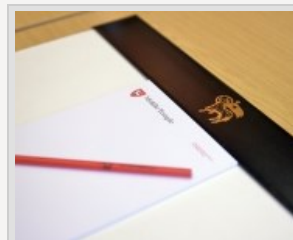

An update from our Estates Department - QEB Bicycle Enclosure

The Inn recently offered its members and tenants the facility to park bicycles in a more secure location by forming the above enclosure.

As this facility is now available, we have decided that parking bicycles elsewhere in the QEB Car Park will no longer be permitted as they have been obstructing access to the car parking bays and they look unsightly.

However as the Inn remains committed to assisting members, tenants and our employees who travel by bicycle, we have decided to make the use of the bicycle enclosure not only free-of-charge but also for their exclusive benefit. If you therefore qualify and wish to park a roadworthy bicycle in the enclosure, please visit our Security Office at 4A Essex Court.

They will upgrade your access rights and issue you with an identification band which is required to be fitted to your bicycle. No charge will be made for the band, the purpose of which is to enable our Security staff to distinguish bicycles belonging to members and tenants. Any bicycles not displaying one of our bands will be removed from the enclosure.
