FASCIST IDEALS. SPEECH BY SIGNOR MUSSOLINI.

FROM OUR OWN CORRESPONDENT. ROME, WEDNESDAY.

The Grand Fascist Council, on which high political expectations were based, took place in Rome last night under the presidency of Signor Mussolini, who made a long and important speech explaining the position of Fascism after the severe crisis caused by the murder of Matteotti. This political crime of the worst character, which stirred the entire country and filled the Government itself with horror, was unjustly attributed to Fascism, remarked Signor Mussolini, and the Parliamentary Opposition, which tried to make political capital out of it, and refused to take part in the sittings of the Chamber, had failed to attain its end. Fascism to-day was as strong as ever, and the country still looked forward to it alone as its hope of salvation. There were imposing demonstrations of Fascists in the provinces, which he had to discourage himself as being unnecessary. The Opposition, divided into numerous groups comprising not only a certain number of Liberals and Catholics, but also Anarchists, Communists, Socialists, and Republicans, represented really only a small part of the community, and were impotent to replace the Fascist Government. They were advocating only a return to the state of things after the armistice, which the vast majority of Italians were far from desiring. Signor Mussolini added:

Fascism to-day can defeat the Opposition by simply standing with its arms at rest. Whilst ignoring the political clamour of the Opposition groups the Government does not intend to ignore the 30,000,000 Italians who are not inscribed on the Fascist or other party lists. What might be called the "Fascistification" of Italy must come, but cannot be hurried. I should like to see created a superior tribunal of control over the Fascist party itself, and would not even object to its being headed by one not a member of the Fascist party. Fascist ideals must and will be realised for the nation's good, and Fascist leaders themselves must submit to the severest discipline and control. Much has been said about the Fascist Militia because its creation and its aims are not understood. Its object is not to be a partisan militia, but a national force for the maintenance of public order.

Naturally, the speech, which lasted a long time, was warmly approved by the Grand Council, and the resolution of approval was passed with applause.

GERMAN EX-CROWN PRINCE IN TRADE AS A BAKER.

BERLIN, WEDNESDAY.

The ex-Crown Prince now runs a big mill and bakery at Oels. The local Millers' Corporation, to which all the millers in the area must belong, asked the ex-Crown Prince to attend a meeting. LONDON POST-OFFICE RAIDED: £140 STOLEN.

At Scotland Yard yesterday it was reported that three men had been concerned in a daring daylight raid on London Fields Post and Money Order Office in Suffolk-road, Shoreditch, as the result of which £140 in Treasury notes and cash was stolen. The raid was made just after nine o'clock yesterday morning, when the sub-postmaster, Mr. Rowland, was alone in the office. One man engaged him in conversation, and then suddenly attacked him, and a severe struggle ensued, during which a confederate seized the notes and money, whilst the third man kept watch at the entrance. When the robbery had been effected the three men ran away, going in different directions, and in spite of attempts to chase them they succeeded in getting out of sight of their pursuers.

Mrs. Lock, who lives immediately opposite the post-office, told a Press representative that Mrs. Rowland, the wife of the sub-postmaster, came rushing across to her and cried out, "They have done him down and taken his money." "I rushed out to find a policeman," said Mrs. Lock, "and got one in West-end-street. I took him back to the post-office, where we found Mr. Rowland in a state of collapse. Mrs. Rowland told me that the men stuffed a cap over her husband's mouth, and one knelt on him while another rifled the till."

Several neighbours said they saw a red car standing at the end of the road. Wednesday is the day on which ex-Service men draw their pensions, and there was, therefore, much more money in the till than there is on an ordinary day. Mrs. Rowland is stated to have returned from getting the money shortly before the raid. Mr. Rowland, who is of middle age, was not seriously injured.

A description of two of the men has been circulated. One is stated to be about 40 years of age, 5ft 7in in height, with dark hair and complexion and a long scar on his face. He was wearing a dark suit and cap. The other man was about 22 years of age, 5ft 4in in height, dark complexion, and was wearing a grey suit.

BOND-STREET JEWEL ROBBERY.

The robbery of a valuable brooch from an Old Bond-street jeweller's shop yesterday was followed by the appearance at Marlborough-street, before Mr. Cancellor, of Daniel Leonard Davies (40), described as of no fixed abode and a book-maker's clerk, who was charged with breaking and entering the shop, 28, Old Bond-street, and stealing an emerald and diamond bar brooch, value £1,250, the property of Holmes and Co.

Detective A. Greenacre said that about two o'clock he was in Stafford-street, and heard cries of "Stop thief!" He saw the prisoner running, hat in hand, closely pursued by a man. Prisoner ran through Stafford-street and other streets to a news, and when witness arrived he found him detained by a Mr. Good-year. When witness told the prisoner that he was a police officer, Davies said: "All right, I will come with you." On the way to the police station prisoner said: "I was hard up and desperate. I just took a chance; it was unlucky."

At the station the prisoner took the brooch from his pocket and handed it to witness, and said: "This is it; that is all I went for." Prisoner also said to the detective: "I am dead unlucky; others use motor-cars and get away with it." Accused was remanded.

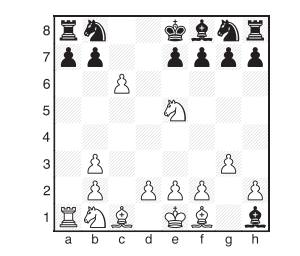
Caruana crunches

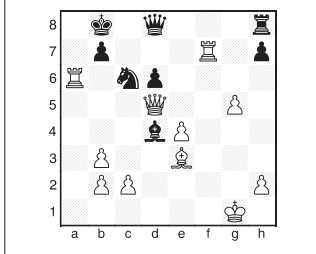
