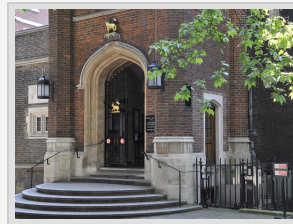




Access to the Bar Awards - Can you provide a placement in chambers or on the bench?

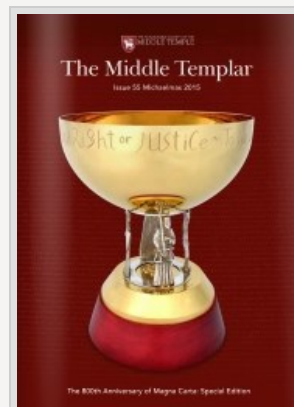

The sessions will be led by Duncan Steen, who has taught meditation and mindfulness for 25 years, all over London, including the City Lit, LSE, YMCA and BA.

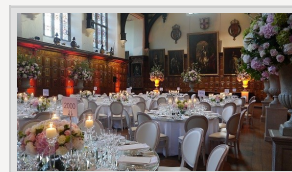

Wedding Open Day - Sunday 17 January 2016

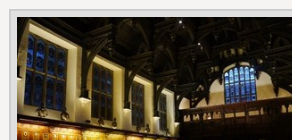
