The Honourable Judge of Appeal Justice Tay Yong Kwang

Supreme Court of Singapore

Justice Tay Yong Kwang joined the Supreme Court in 1981, first as Assistant Registrar and then as Deputy Registrar. In 1989, he served in the Official Assignee and Public Trustee's Office. He then served as District Judge from 1991-1997 at the Subordinate Courts (renamed as the State Courts in 2014). In 1997, he was appointed Judicial Commissioner. Subsequently he was appointed Judge of the Supreme Court in 2003 and Judge of Appeal on 1 August 2016.

He was born in Singapore in 1956, and obtained his Bachelor of Laws from the National University of Singapore in 1981. In 1984, he was admitted as an advocate and solicitor in Singapore. He later received his Master of Laws from the University of Cambridge in 1986.



Ms Nicola Padfield

Master, Fitzwilliam College, Cambridge

Nicola Padfield is Master of Fitzwilliam College, Cambridge, and a Reader in Criminal and Penal Justice at the Law Faculty, University of Cambridge, where she has worked for more than 25 years. She has a broad research lens, engaged in both law and in socio-legal-criminological research. She is a leading European expert on sentencing law, including the law and practice of release from (and recall to) prison. A barrister by training, she has published widely on criminal law, sentencing and criminal justice. Her books include *The Criminal Justice Process: Text and Materials* (5th edition, with Jonathan Bild, 2016); *Criminal Law* (10th edit, 2016); *Beyond the Tariff: Human rights and the release of life sentence prisoners* (2002). She has edited collections of essays, and for nearly 20 years was the editor of the influential monthly *Archbold Review*. She now writes the monthly Editorials in the *Criminal Law Review*. She sat as a Recorder from 2002-2014, and is a Bencher of the Middle Temple, serving on the Education Committee.

His Honour Judge Philip Bartle QC

Luton Crown Court

Called to the Bar by Middle Temple in 1976, Philip was appointed Silk in 2004. He worked for over 30 years at the Bar (specialising in professional negligence) before being appointed a Circuit Judge in July 2012 to try serious crime. He is an experienced commercial mediator. He was a member of the Bar Standards Board. He has been an advocacy trainer for many years and was director of the South Eastern Circuit's annual Advanced Advocacy Course at Keble College, Oxford from 2011-2014. He is a Bencher of the Inn.



Mr N Sreenivasan SC

Managing Director, Straits Law Practice LLC

Sreeni is actively engaged in arbitration, trial and appellate advocacy across both commercial and criminal practice areas. Sreeni started his legal career in the Singapore Legal Service from 1985 to 1990, immediately after graduating.

Sreeni's notable cases include *Als Memasa & another v UBS AG* [2012] SGCA 43, *The Oriental Insurance Co Ltd v Reliance National Asia Re Pte Ltd* [2008] 3 SLR (R) 121 and the *City Harvest* case, one of the longest running and largest fraud cases in Singapore). *Asialaw Profiles* states: "... N Sreenivasan garners praise for

being a 'focused, tenacious and skillful litigator who has shown an ability to handle difficult and sensitive matters'."

Sreeni has served as Council member and Treasurer of the Law Society of Singapore, and has chaired various committees, including its Advocacy Committee. He has been an advocacy trainer for 22 years, and conducted courses in Singapore, Brunei and Sabah. Sreeni is a Fellow of the Singapore Institute of Arbitrators and the Chartered Institute of Arbitrators. Sreeni remains active on the volunteer scene as a member of the Law Society Pro-Bono Management Committee.

Ms Mavis Chionh SC

Third Solicitor-General and Chief Prosecutor, Attorney-General's Chambers

Mavis Chionh graduated from the University of Oxford with a First Class Honours degree in Jurisprudence and with the award of the University's Norton Rose Prize in Company Law. She also holds a Master's degree in Chinese Law from the National University of Singapore and was called to the Bar at Middle Temple. She joined the Singapore Legal Service in 1991.

In the course of her Legal Service career, Ms Chionh has served as a Justices' Law Clerk; an Assistant Registrar of the Supreme Court; a Deputy Public Prosecutor; a District Judge; Deputy Principal Senior State Counsel in the Civil Division of the Attorney-General's Chambers; Official Assignee and Public Trustee in the Insolvency and Public Trustee's Office; and Chief Prosecutor of the Financial & Technology Crime Division in the Attorney-General's Chambers. On 1 April 2015, Ms Chionh was appointed Chief Prosecutor of the Criminal Justice Division in the Attorney-General's Chambers, which prosecutes a broad range of offences from homicide and sex crimes to public order offences and drug offences.

Ms Chionh was appointed Senior Counsel in January 2015. In recognition of her outstanding contributions to Public Service, she was also awarded the Public Administration Medal (Gold) in 2015. On 1 August 2016, Ms Chionh was appointed the Third Solicitor-General of the Attorney-General's Chambers ("AGC"). Ms Chionh will hold this appointment concurrently with her current appointment as Chief Prosecutor of the Criminal Justice Division.



The Honourable Judicial Commissioner Debbie Ong

Supreme Court of Singapore

Prior to her appointment to the Bench, Judicial Commissioner Debbie Ong had been a law academic at the NUS Law Faculty. She is currently Judicial Commissioner of the Supreme Court of Singapore. A leading family law scholar for many years, she has published widely in family law. She is a member of the International Advisory Board of the UK Child and Family Quarterly Journal, and formerly, amongst other roles, a volunteer Family Court Mediator, Chairperson of the Governance Committee of Tampines Family Service Centre, member of the Review Board constituted under the Children and Young Persons Act.

Professor Leong Wai Kum is a senior member of the NUS Faculty of Law where she continues to teach Family Law. She dedicates herself to researching and improving the Family Law in Singapore. She submitted private representations to Parliament in 1979 and 1995 on major reviews of the Women's Charter. Professor Leong has published widely including her latest book: Elements of Family Law in Singapore 2d (Singapore: LexisNexis, 2013).



Ms Michelle Woodworth

Partner, RHTLaw Taylor Wessing LLP

Michelle Woodworth is a Partner at RHTLaw Taylor Wessing's Litigation and Dispute Resolution Practice. Michelle graduated with LL.B (Hons) and has been admitted to the Bar at Middle Temple, Supreme Court of Singapore, Supreme Court of NSW, Australia and High Court of Australia. Michelle was in private practice for over 12 years, then served as a District Judge of the Subordinate Courts of Singapore (now the Family Justice Courts). Thereafter she joined the Law Society of Singapore as Director and Head of their Representation and Law Reform Department before returning to private practice. Michelle tutors Family Law at Part B of the Singapore Bar Examinations and Co-Chairs the Law Society's Family Law Practice Committee. She authored a chapter on custody, care and control and access of children in a book launched in May 2005 entitled "The Art of Family Lawyering" and edited its 2nd edition in January 2013. Michelle is an Advocate and Solicitor, Mediator (IMI and SIMI Certified, SMC Accredited), Collaborative Family Practitioner and Court-Appointed Child Representative.

The Right Honourable Lord Dyson

The Master of the Rolls, England and Wales

The Rt. Hon. Lord Dyson was appointed as Master of the Rolls with effect from 1st October 2012 and retires from the office in October 2016. The Master of the Rolls is the Head of Civil Justice, and the second most senior judicial position in England and Wales, after the Lord Chief Justice. He was called to the Bar in 1968 and made a bencher in 1990. He was a Judge of the High Court of Justice 1993-2001. He was the Presiding Judge for the Technology and Construction Court between 1998 and 2001. In 2001 he was appointed as a Lord Justice of Appeal.

Lord Dyson was appointed Justice of the Supreme Court in April 2010. He was the second Justice to be appointed to that court directly. Since 1998 he has been a Fellow of the Society of Advanced Legal Studies and an Honorary Fellow of the Hebrew University of Jerusalem since 2004. He has been awarded Honorary degrees by the University of Essex, University College London and the University of Leeds. Lord Dyson is married with a daughter and a son.



The Honourable Mr Justice Barma JA

Justice of Appeal of the Court of Appeal of the High Court (HK)

Mr Justice Aarif Barma read law at Oxford, where he obtained his BA and BCL, and was then called to the Bar by the Middle Temple in 1983. He was admitted to the Hong Kong Bar in 1983, and after pupillage in London, practised in Hong Kong from 1985 until 2003, when he was appointed as a Judge of the Court of First Instance of the High Court. In 2012, he became a Justice of Appeal, and now sits in the Court of Appeal in Hong Kong. He became a Bencher of the Inn in September 2015.



The Honourable Justice Steven Chong

Supreme Court of Singapore

The Honourable Justice Steven Chong graduated with a Bachelor of Laws (Honours) from the National University of Singapore in 1982. He was admitted as an advocate and solicitor of the Supreme Court of Singapore in 1983, and entered into legal practice with one of Singapore's top law firms, Drew & Napier, that same year. He eventually became its Joint Managing Partner at the end of 1997. In 1998, Justice Chong joined another leading Singapore law firm, Rajah & Tann, where he was appointed, first, Senior Partner and then Managing Partner. In

January 1998, he was also appointed Senior Counsel. After 27 years in legal practice, he was appointed to the Bench on 1 October 2009. Justice Chong served as the Attorney-General of the Republic of Singapore from 25 June 2012 to 24 June 2014. Upon completion of his term, he returned to the Supreme Court.

The Right Honourable Lord Justice Christopher Clarke

Court of Appeal of England and Wales

The Rt Hon Lord Justice Christopher Clarke read Classics and Law at Gonville & Caius College Cambridge, of which he is now an Honorary Fellow. A Harmsworth Scholar, he was Called to the Bar in 1969, took silk in 1984, and became a Bencher in 1991. In 1975 he became an Attorney of the Supreme Court of Turks and Caicos Islands. He was formerly in practice at and became Head of Brick Court Chambers. He was a Judge of the Courts of Appeal of Jersey and Guernsey from 1998. He was a Councillor of the International Bar Association from 1988-1990; Chairman of the Commercial Bar Association from 1993-95; and a Member of the Bar Council from 1993-99. He was Counsel to the Bloody Sunday Inquiry, 1998-2004. He sat as a High Court Judge in the Commercial Court from 2005-13 and was appointed a Lord Justice of Appeal in 2013. He is a member of the Court of Ecclesiastical Causes Reserved. He is the Treasurer for 2016. He is married with two daughters and a son.



Judge of Appeal Andrew Phang Boon Leong

Supreme Court of Singapore

Justice Andrew Phang was appointed to the Supreme Court as Judicial Commissioner on 3 January 2005.

Born in Singapore, he received his Bachelor of Laws from the National University of Singapore ("NUS") in 1982. He pursued his postgraduate studies at Harvard University, where he was conferred his Master of Laws and Doctor of Juridical Science degrees in 1984 and 1988, respectively. In 1990, he was admitted as an advocate and solicitor in Singapore before being appointed as Senior Counsel in 2004. He taught at the NUS Law Faculty from 1982 to 2000. In 2000, he was appointed Professor of Law at the Singapore Management University ("SMU"), and a year later, became Chair of the Department of Law at SMU's Business School. His extensive publications include the local edition of Cheshire, Fifoot and Furmston's Law of Contract. He is also General Editor, as well as contributor to, The Law of Contract in Singapore (Academy Publishing, 2012).

Cavinder Bull SC

Drew & Napier

Cavinder has an active practice in complex litigation and international arbitration. He is engaged in trial and appellate advocacy at all levels of the Singapore Courts and has appeared as counsel in international arbitration in various countries. Cavinder graduated with First Class Honours in law from Oxford University in 1992. He was called to the Bar at Middle Temple the following year, placing fourth in the Bar examinations. He returned to Singapore and passed the Singapore Bar exams, winning the prize for top candidate.

Cavinder worked for the Chief Justice of Singapore as a Justices' Law Clerk before joining Drew & Napier in 1994 as a litigation associate. In 1995, he was awarded the Lee Kuan Yew Scholarship and left for Harvard Law School where he received an LL.M. He passed the New York Bar exams and was admitted to practice in New York. Cavinder practised as a litigation associate with Sullivan & Cromwell in New York until late 1997 when he returned to Singapore and Drew & Napier. He was made a partner of Drew & Napier in 1998 and a Director of Drew & Napier LLC in May 2002.



Associate Professor Pearlie Koh

Singapore Management University

Associate Professor Pearlie Koh received her LLB from the National University of Singapore and obtained the LLM from the University of Melbourne. She is admitted as an advocate and solicitor in Singapore. Pearlie presently teaches at the School of Law, Singapore Management University, where she teaches the Law of Business Organisations and Corporate Law. Her main area of research interest is in company law, although she has also written in contract law. Her publications include articles published in both local and international peer-reviewed journals, as well as the book "Company Law" published by LexisNexis. She co-wrote the book "Corporate Law" and also contributed chapters to the book "The Law of Contract in Singapore" published by Academy Publishing.
