About the Asgard

From her building in 1905 by Colin Archer, the celebrated Norwegian naval architect, to her pivotal role in the 1914 Howth gun-running and her later use as Ireland's first national sail-training vessel, the yacht has had many incarnations.

In the late 1990s many sailing enthusiasts wished to see the Asgard vessel sail again and argued that this would be the most fitting way to preserve her for future generations.

Examination of the ship's hull revealed that there was considerable damage from corrosion which had been commented on as far back as the ship's refit in 1968. Those who wished to conserve the vessel as a museum-piece argued that to make the vessel seaworthy would destroy almost all of the original structure making the vessel merely a namesake that would be forgotten.

After much debate, it was decided to preserve the vessel as a museum piece and she was moved to a holding site in the Royal Dublin Society in 2001. In 2005 she was moved to her present location in Collins Barracks. She stands as a monument to the skill of both the original builders and the conservation team, as well as a reminder of the turbulent events of 1914.
